Subject: Removal of bridges, Ham Canyon and Dago

I am happy to report that both the bridges at Ham Canyon, and Dago Creek have been removed. This is a culmination of a cooperative effort of two lumber companies, Rockport Redwood and Simpson Timber and the Dept. of Fish and Game. These two bridges have been complete barriers for many years and now they no longer exist. This makes available to Steelhead and Salmon a great deal more good spawning area.


I have included photographs depicting the bridges before and after their removal. You will note reference points indicated by the arrows; this will help orient the pictures to get a better idea of the conditions before and after. In addition to removing the bridges the log jams above were also removed. In the case of Ham canyon the jam was completely removed and a channel was cut through the jam at Dago creek.

I am satisfied with the job and request a letter from the San Francisco office to both Companies indicating our pleasure and satisfaction with the work done. This letter will also serve as verification to the companies so they can release payment to the contractor who performed the work.

It is anticipated that new crossings of these two creeks will be made next year. I intend to make sure the new bridges are constructed so as to protect the streams and not allow a repetition of the conditions just corrected.
